What is the BSP?



The BSP is the plan for how to spend the results-based payment. A BSP was disclosed in 2021 and was the basis for distributions of the first payment made to the Government under the Program of USD20.9 million. Drawing on lessons learned from that initial distribution, the BSP is now being revised and public feedback on the revisions is being sought through this public consultation process.

What is the <u>EK-JERP</u>?



The EK-JERP is a program that aims to reduce deforestation and forest degradation in East Kalimantan. Through this program, the Government of Indonesia measures reductions in greenhouse gas emissions as a result of reduced deforestation and forest degradation, and earns a 'results-based payment' from Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) Carbon Fund.

What is the IPP?



The IPP is a safeguards document for the program that provides guidance on the implementation of activities to ensure the protection of customary (adat) communities. It includes guidance on the processes required to obtain free, prior and informed consent from affected communities for various activities in the program.
